Local Woman's Art Exhibit in New Jersey

The exhibit, entitled "From Where I Sit: The Spaces in Our Lives", will include an opening reception next door to the Gallery, at the Present Day Club, on Monday, Sept. 11, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m.

Haaga, born in London, is married with two children, and has been a California oil painter since 1995. She has exhibited both in

Montrose and Pasadena over the past decade. She received her BA from Vassar College and has studied management at the Wharton School in Philadelphia.

For this exhibit, Haaga brings paintings offering viewers an opportunity to observe more carefully and participate in the world around them.

"The joy/job of an artist is to catch fleeting moments in spaces that constantly change—and capture spaces that lead viewers into their own spaces, their own stories," she said.
